Pupils in Primary 7 are developing their science, technology, engineering and maths skills in advance of the upcoming 'STEM Challenge' competition.

In keeping with our school policy, the decision to close the school will be made before 8.30am (where possible) and, if necessary, will be made **the night before** with an aim of providing working parents with more time to find alternative and suitable supervision for children. When a decision has been made to close the PLEASE NOTE: school, the announcement will be made as follows: 1. Firstly, by text message directly to parents using the school's messaging service (to mobile numbers previously provided by parents). 2. Secondly, on the BBC News Website and Radio Ulster. Parents should be aware that these BBC services require email confirmation directly from the school which includes a validation code and so, once announced, this can be taken as a formal school closure. However, it does take some time for the BBC website to be updated. During severe weather, parents and staff should always check these sources before travelling to school.
